



Held our first live conference

Our event set out a challenge to the sector to consider how we all could, no should, nay must, reframe the future of early childhood education. It was a natural follow up from our launch our hugely popular online conference in October. That all made us feel like a movement has begun. Jan explored in more detail the policy paper and set out the actions required. He again called for a mission that could take the messages from the sector out to the wider education community, to better nurture and grow everyone's understanding of the work we all do. Jan asked for us all to identify the things that connect us, and not focus only on those micro-details that can all to easily and unhelpfully drive us apart. He suggested that we need to embed the understanding and use of children's learning behaviours and as a consequence of this; proposed the Characteristics of Effective Learning supporting the EYFS be reviewed and brought up to date. We also enjoyed a stellar line up of expert speakers: Dr Jools Page, Dr Lala Manners, and Sarah Tillotson from the Education Endowment Foundation, with debate and discussion chaired by former Nursery World editor Liz Roberts. 
We went local

- We were the guest speakers at Doncaster's EYFS schools event in November providing a national briefing which included informing everyone about the Stronger Practice Hubs and reviewing OFSTED's 'Best Start in Life: Setting the Scene' and how this connects with an informed approach to pedagogy in the EYFS.
 We returned in January to address headteachers and providing an overview of the Early Year Recovery Programme and the importance of effective CPD.
- We spent a day in Buckinghamshire. In the morning we held EYFS briefings for headteachers focussing on the use of EYFS Profile data to support the quality of practice and provision, in the afternoon we worked with managers and leaders from across the early education sector exploring effective approach to pedagogy.
- In March we delivered a virtual briefing for EYFS leads in schools and spoke at the regional NDNA conference for Nottinghamshire and Leicestershire exploring the current challenges and the hey! mission.
- A keynote conference speech was given in Wakefield for their early years conference in June that explored the potency of EYFS educators and the key principles and practices that should underpin a pedagogical repertoire.
- We also started curriculum development consultancy alongside colleagues at the Astrea multi-academy trust in the South Yorkshire region.


Online and on-site services and programmes for parents, schools, academies, all types of early years setting, organisations, local authorities, and national government departments.

Compact two-hour sessions up to full days containing bespoke continuous professional development for differentiated groups (leaders and managers, headteachers and schools, practitioners of all types and levels) on all relevant aspects such as:

- Implementing the revised EYFS, achieving change and impacts.
- Supporting curriculum progression.
- Creating quality experiences that nurture children's cognitive development.
- Developing a pedagogical repertoire.
- Effective assessment, to support learning and demonstrate progress and impact on children's learning and development.
- Supporting consistency of assessment judgements through developing strategies for effective moderation.

hey! In best practice.

We come and work with you in your early years workplace. This is more specific and targeted in nature to support identified elements of practice, most likely involving an initial self-complete questionnaire, a half-day initial audit observation visit, an onsite support visit with suggested actions, bespoke training input(s) to work through the suggested actions, and a gap task to review what needs to happen next. Usually this is for 3-6 days.
